#### Time Zone:

Lithuania operates on Eastern European Time (EET), which is UTC+2. During daylight saving time, from late March to late October, Lithuania switches to Eastern European Summer Time (EEST), which is UTC+3.

#### Visa Requirements:

Check the visa requirements for your country before traveling to Lithuania. Students from EU/EEA countries do not need a visa to study in Lithuania, but students from other countries may need to obtain a student visa or residence permit.

#### Healthcare:


Lithuania has a modern healthcare system, with hospitals and clinics offering high-quality medical care. EU/EEA students may be eligible for free or discounted healthcare services with a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC), while non-EU/EEA students may need to purchase health insurance.

#### Currency:

The official currency of Lithuania is the Euro (EUR). ATMs are widely available throughout the country, and credit cards are accepted in most shops, restaurants, and hotels.

#### Banking:

Opening a bank account in Lithuania is essential for daily life to enjoy all services and products . You'll need your passport/ID, residence permit, and proof of need for banking services, like a work contract. Choose from various banks like Swedbank, SEB, Luminor, and more, including online options like Revolut and Paysera. Having a local account is crucial for receiving salary, scholarships, and online shopping without extra fees. Plus, it grants access to public services via the E-Government Gateway. Simplify your life in Vilnius with a local bank account.



### Getting around in Vilnius

With a city as cozy and compact as Vilnius, getting around is a breeze. You'll find plenty of transport options available. If you prefer public transport, the city offers a fully integrated bus and trolleybus network with one of the newest bus fleets in Europe.

For those who prefer the convenience of cabs, there are the Uber, Bolt, and E-taxi apps. If you like driving but don't have a car, you can use Citybee - a fantastic car-sharing app. Citybee and Bolt also offer electric scooters! Additionally, the Trafi app provides up-to-the-minute information on all of the city's public transport and traffic directly to your phone.

#### By public transport






When it comes to safety, many claim that countries in the eastern part of Europe are much safer than popular European destinations such as Paris or London.

Lithuania is known as a relatively safe place to visit, with a low crime rate of a 79 safety index.

#### EMERGENCY CONTACT IN LITHUANIA: 112

is a single contact number, available throughout the European Union and outside its territory for reporting an accident or a sudden threat and for calling the emergency services – police, fire and rescue service or ambulance. It is free and is available 24/7.



**Pre-paid SIM cards** with plans for data, calls and SMS usually cost 3-8 EUR. SIM cards are available at Narvesen and Lietuvos Spauda newsstands, as well as, most of the bigger supermarkets. Signing a contract for monthly service is possible, but requires a residence permit and in some cases, a deposit. To avoid committing to a fixed-term contract, purchase a pre-paid card. Choose from the following pre-paid cards:







You can also sign a **fixed-term contract** (usually for 24 months) with any mobile network operator in their shops. The available mobile network operators:







Lithuania is one of the global leaders in terms of internet speed. Free Wi-Fi is available in most public spaces, like coffee shops, libraries or parks. Sometimes public Wi-Fi has the password, but you can get a password after asking local staff about it. Lithuania ranks second in the world for cyber security. Internet quality is 22% ahead of the global average.

If you wish to set up a permanent Internet connection at home, sign a contract with one of the Internet providers and purchase a modem (extra cost). Here are the internet service providers in Lithuania:













### SHOPPING

Shopping in Lithuania offers a convenient and accessible experience for everyone. Most stores are open every day from 8 am until 10 pm, providing opportunities to purchase essentials.

However, if you find yourself in need of something outside of regular store hours, don't worry! Many gas stations (Viada, Circle K, Orlen, etc.) in Lithuania are equipped with convenience products (essential items, snacks and drinks) and remain open 24/7. Many stores accept major credit cards, making transactions more convenient for international students.

Welcome to the party! Vilnius is a lively city, full of conversation and entertainment both day and night. Everyone is welcome to join in! What to expect? Read on.






#### 8 | VILNIUS PINK SOUP FEST / 1JUNE 2024

## Why September always feels like the start of a new year?

In Lithuania, the academic calendar typically follows a two-semester system, with the academic year starting in September and ending in June.

#### HERE'S AN OVERVIEW OF THE TYPICAL ACADEMIC CALENDAR:

#### **Autumn Semester:**

**September:** Beginning of the academic year, enrollment, and registration.

**September/October:** Start of classes for undergraduate and graduate programs.

October/November: Midterm exams

or assessments.

**December:** Exams and winter break.

#### **Spring Semester:**

**January:** Resumption of classes after exams and winter break.

**February/March:** Classes for for undergraduate and graduate programs.

April/May: Midterm exams or

assessments.

**June:** End of the academic year, exams or assessments and graduation ceremonies.

In addition to regular semesters, there may be summer sessions or intensive courses offered during the summer months for students who wish to accelerate their studies or make up for missed credits.

As for the grading system, Lithuania typically uses a 10point grading scale, with 10 being the highest and 1 being the lowest. The grading scale is as follows:

10: Excellent

9: Very Good

8: Good

7: Satisfactory

6: Sufficient

5: Weak

4: Very Weak

3: Poor

2: Very Poor

1: Fail



## UNIVERSITY MAP

Mykolas Romeris University is divided into 5 buildings. Below is a University map, so you can better understand the location of each building. During studies you will get a schedule with titles of the study subjects and classroom numbers. The classroom number may look like C-II-230. It means that you should go to the second (II) building and look for a 230 classroom. Please remember that classrooms which numbers start from 1 are on the 1st floor, if the number starts from 2 - 2nd floor, and so on.





## EMBARK YOUR ACADEMIC JOURNEY

#### ADMISSION DEADLINES

Mark your calendar with the following admission deadlines:

- February 1st, 2024 June 1st, 2024: For applicants from non-EU countries
- February 1st, 2024 July 26th, 2024:
   For applicants from EU/EFTA countries and countries with a VFS Global center, or those who do not require a Temporary Residence Permit for arrival in Lithuania.

#### **Application Steps**

- Fill in the Application Form: Complete the online application form at <u>apply.mruni.eu</u> with accurate and detailed information about your educational background and personal details.
- Pay the Application Fee: A non-refundable application fee is required for processing your application. For non-EU citizens, the application fee is 100 euros, while EU citizens and MRU alumni are eligible for a reduced fee of 50 euros.
- Receive Application Evaluation Results: Our dedicated admissions team will carefully review your application and provide you with timely feedback on your application status.
- Confirm Acceptance and Pay Fees: Upon receiving your application evaluation results, confirm your acceptance by paying the first-year tuition fee and a non-refundable registration fee of 50 euros.
- Sign the Study Contract: Finalize your admission by signing the study contract, which outlines the terms and conditions of your enrolment at MRU.
- Start Temporary Residence Permit Application
  Procedure: If applicable, begin the process of obtaining a
  Temporary Residence Permit to study in Lithuania.





#### **FOR EU STUDENTS**

For EU citizens, the process of employment in Lithuania is quite simple. you do not need any additional document and working hours are not limited.

#### FOR NON-EU STUDENTS

Non-EU undergraduate (bachelor) students willing to work during their studies must obtain a Temporary Residence Permit. Only then you can work up to 20 hours per week during your studies at the University.

However, you can work full-time (40 hours per week) under the following exceptions:

- 1. During the summer holidays for time determined by higher education institution;
- 2. Work carried out as a part of an internship;
- 3. During the 3 months after graduation.

Non-EU Master's and PhD students who have a Temporary Residence Permit for studies can work full-time during their studies. No additional work permits are required.




