PROJECTS YOU WILL WORK ON

Leading a team of coordinators of regional groups

Currently, we have seven active volunteer groups in various corners of the country. We regularly meet with their coordinators, both in person and online. We help them realize the set goals and we also help them with the preparation of activist events, or we collaborate with them on nationwide projects. At the same time, we create a supportive environment for the emergence of new activist groups.

Ambassadorship of the Letter Writing Marathon

Every year we recruit five to ten volunteers for the position of Marathon ambassador. The letter writing marathon is a worldwide event whose goal is to help the unjustly imprisoned to get free. We write letters not only to the prisoners themselves, but also to the authorities and directly ask them to release the prisoners. About twenty thousand letters are sent every year from the Czech Republic alone. The embassies have the role of mediators in the campaign: they address potential organizers of correspondence events and explain to them the possibilities of the campaign. The embassy team needs to be trained, meet regularly and support them in their work.

Stands at festivals

During the year, we have stands at human rights, cultural and other events in Prague and in the regions. Before each event, we assemble a volunteer team that helps at the festival stand. We regularly have stands at, for example, Prague Pride and other regional prides, but you can also look forward to a stand on Tibet Day.
